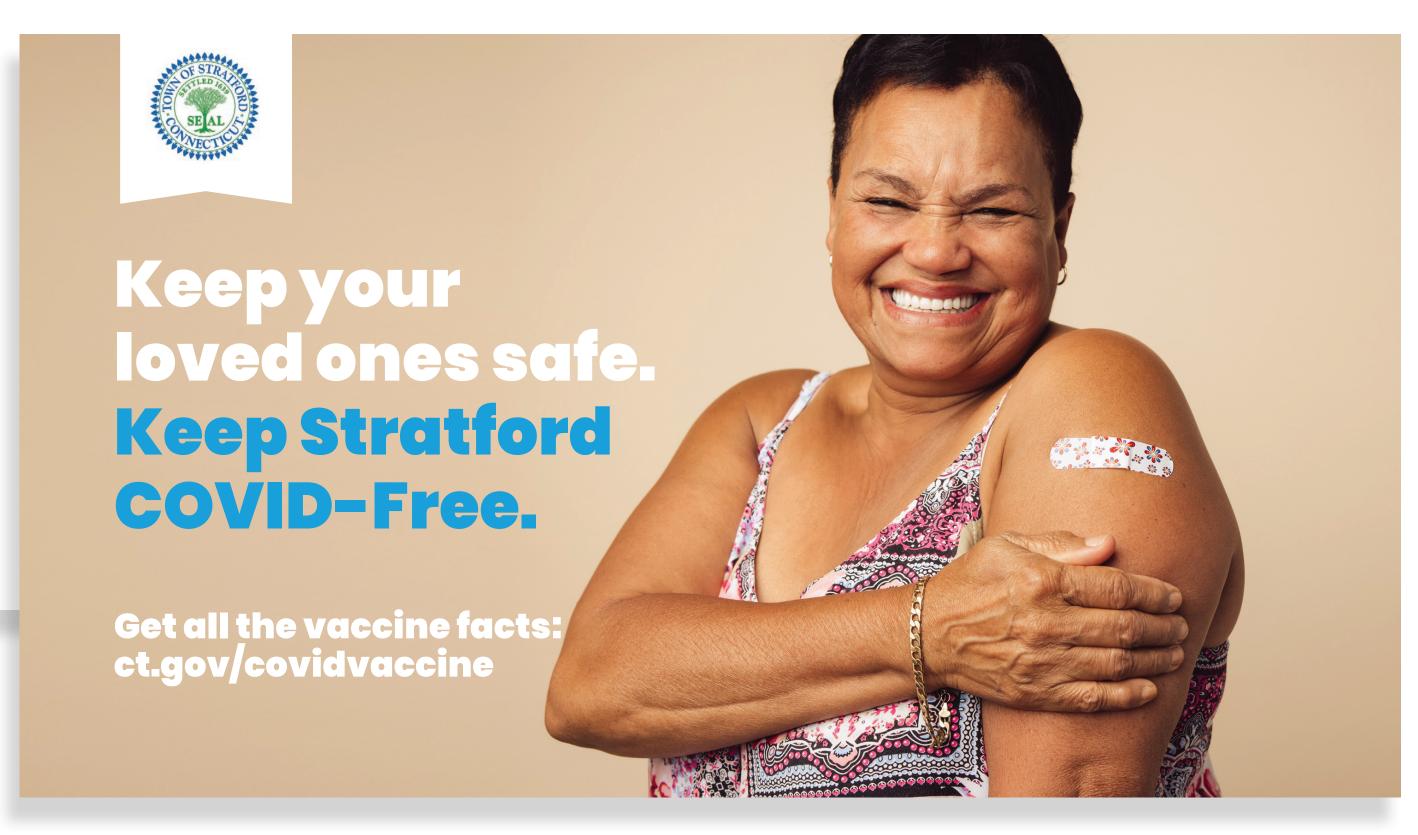

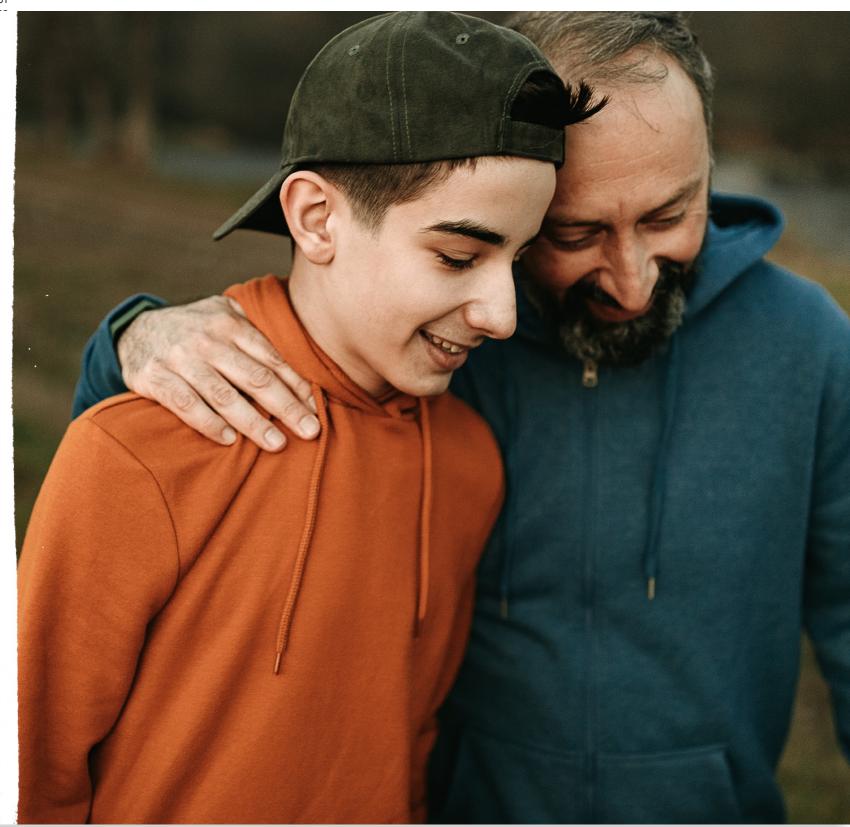

## Put Prescription Drugs in Their Place.

Drug abuse takes all forms, including the off-script use of prescription drugs. You can protect your family with a few simple precautions.

Keep your pills stored in a secure spot. And if you no longer need them, dispose of them safely by dropping them off at the medication drop box in the lobby of the Stratford Police Department — open 24/7.

Drop-off is anonymous and contact-free, and there is no charge.

Together we can keep the drugs out of circulation so they cannot be abused.
